

SITUATION

- The death toll in Nepal has exceeded 7 300 and the number of injured has reached 14 300, according to the Nepalese Government. Most of the dead are in the district of Sindhupalchowk (2 838), while in Kathmandu 37 600 buildings have been completely **destroyed**.
- International humanitarian assistance continues with efforts targeting also remote villages, which are only accessible by aerial means and may not have been reached yet. Two UNDAC/EU Civil protection teams are operational in the humanitarian hubs established in Sindulpalchowk and Gorkha districts. Several Advanced Medical Posts (AMP) are

- Rainy season (monsoon season): from June to September
