

- · The death toll resulting from the earthquake which affected central Nepal on 25 April has now increased to 7 759 and the number of injured has reached 16 434, according to the Government of Nepal. The highest number of deaths has been recorded in the district of Sindhupalchowk (2 991). A further increase of these figures is still expected
- as access to remote areas is improving. Almost 300 000 houses have reportedly been destroyed, with 270 000 damaged and in need of repair. In Sindhupalchowk, up to 96% of houses are reported destroyed in many villages. This level of
