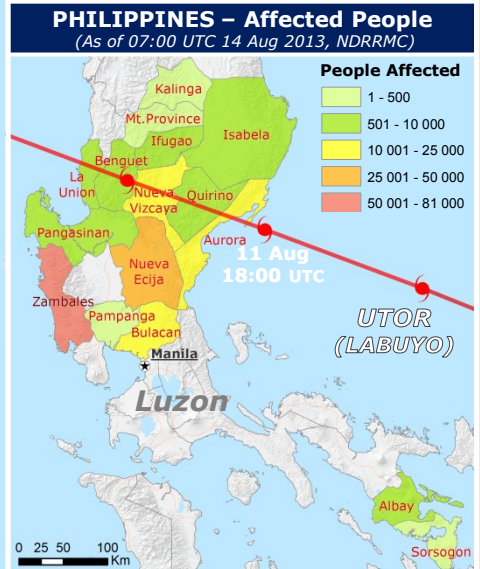
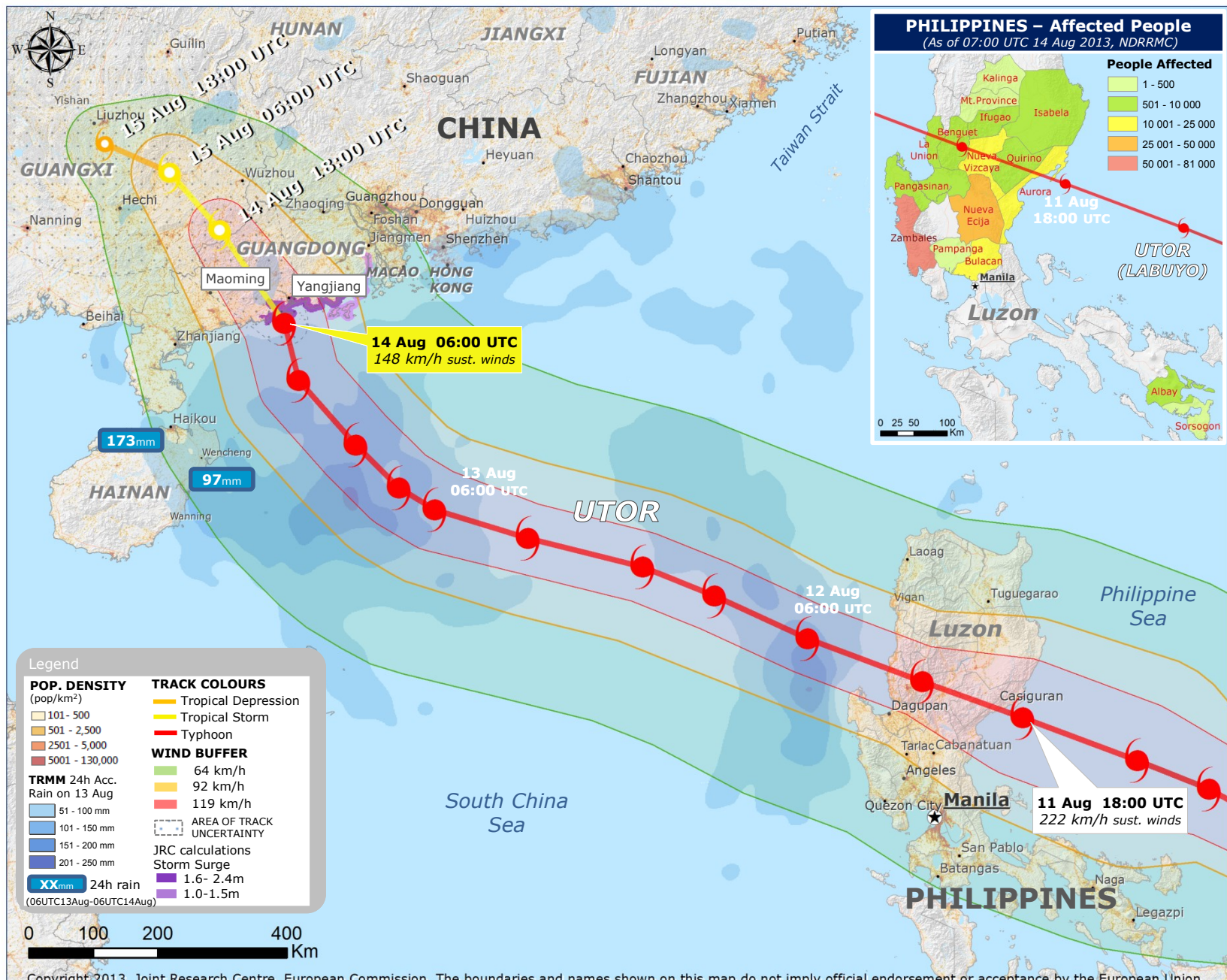


14 August 2013: Philippines, China – Tropical Cyclone UTOR



SITUATION

CHINA

- Typhoon UTOR made landfall in the coastal areas of Yangxi County (near Yangjiang) in Guangdong province at 07:50 UTC on 14 Aug; ca. 2 hours earlier it had a max sust. wind speed of 148 km/h. In the next 24h it is forecast to move NW over mainland China, weakening.
- On 14-15 Aug, strong winds and heavy to very heavy rainfall might affect Guangdong, N Hainan and SE Guangxi provinces. JRC calculations, using as input the data of 06:00 UTC 14 Aug, indicated a possible storm surge of the order of 1.6-2.4m in the coastal area near Yangjiang Guangdong, for 14 Aug morning.
- As of early 14 Aug (UTC), a Red Typhoon Warning was in effect (China Meteorological Administration).
- As of 14 Aug morning, media reported transport disruptions in Guangdong and Hong-Kong. According to Xinhua, 98 000 people have been preventively relocated in Hainan and 60 215 people relocated in Maoming City (Guangdong Province).

PHILIPPINES

- Due to the passage of UTOR (locally known as LABUYO) over Luzon on 11-12 Aug, there were (as of NDRRMC report of 07:00 UTC 14 Aug): 7 dead, 7 people injured, 5 missing, 204 627 people affected in 16 provinces of Luzon (see inset map), 11 855 people housed in 57 evacuation centres, 5 868 houses damaged (738 completely damaged).
